Although that lodge closed when the base did, he continues to maintain membership in the unified German-American Lodge. He has also been a member of Scottish Rite for almost 35 years entering in Dallas, TX. He entered the Shrine at Syria Temple in Pittsburgh, PA almost 25 years ago and transferred to Bahia 20 years ago when he and his family moved back to Oviedo.

Bahia Shriner of the Month for the month of February 2021 and Shriner of the year for the Villages Shrine Club 2021


For 7 years, my wife Claire and I have attended the PGA Shrine Golf Tournament in Las Vegas as a Shrine Volunteer.

I was born in Port Barrel, Alaska, and my father served as a Lieutenant Colonel in the United States Air Force, allowing me to travel widely during my childhood. This





BURN FIRST AID

Shriners Children's research could reduce likelihood of hospitalization

While most Americans know running cool water over a burn as first aid, not many know the optimal time is at least 20 minutes.

Shriners Children's burn surgeon Tina Palmieri, M.D., recently provided evidence that this is the case in an emergency medicine journal article published together with Australian authors. Dr. Palmieri, the newly named chief of burns at Shriners Children's Northern California, was the only American on the paper. According to the article, evidence shows cool running water not only appears to stop the progress of the damage occurring from a burn wound but also lessens the chance that the person burned will need surgery or skin grafting or be admitted to the hospital.

In addition, according to the article, you can use cool running water at any time for up to three hours after the burn and still get benefit.

Dr. Palmieri said that any water from a house faucet or a garden hose should be cool enough to provide the adequate amount of cooling, as the pipes come from underground. She also said that using cool running water as first aid for any burn less than or equal to five palm prints in size should be safe and is recommended. For bigger burns, however, she advises heading immediately to the hospital.

According to research, 20 minutes of cool running water decreases the likelihood of a full thickness burn by 63%, decreases the need for skin grafting by 46% and decreases the need for surgical treatment at all by 36%. Time to heal skin is improved by one day, which can be very important for scarring.

If you've ever tried it, you also know cool running water can

ease the pain of a burn.

The challenge with this recommendation is, that when a person has been burned, 20 minutes is a very long time to stand still and keep the injury under the water.

"Twenty minutes can seem an eternity when you need to stay under the water and not move. Twenty minutes is hard to do," Dr. Palmieri said. "You almost have to actually time it."

Dr. Palmieri, who is a past president of the American Burn Association, noted that, while the "20 minutes" part of this advice is not especially well known here in the United States, it tends to be common knowledge in Europe, Australia and New Zealand.

The difference may be because physicians and public health officials in the U.S. tend to be more conservative than those in other countries, and they haven't felt the evidence was strong enough to warrant the recommendation. Until now, perhaps.

Some of the reluctance to share "20 minutes" also may stem from the fact that people tend to think about big burns. Therefore, some experts worry that a person might delay going to the hospital immediately for a larger burn that needs medical attention, Dr. Palmieri said. But only 10% of burns cover more than 10% of the body, she noted.

Ill. Sir Ken had been a member of Eola Lodge 207 in Orlando since 1965 and was recently presented his 60 year pin. He was a member of the Orlando Scottish Rite and York Rite Bodies and became a Shriner November 26, 1965, at Bahia's Fall Ceremonial. He had served as a Bahia DeMolay Dad, and in 1982 he received the Order of DeMolay Legion of Honor (Active) Award. He was a member of the Royal Order of Jesters in which he served 10 years as Impersario. He was President of the Roadrunners Unit in 1974.

Starting with his appointment to Outer Guard in 1973 he progressed in 1974 to Captain of the Guard, Second Ceremonial Master in 1975, First Ceremonial Master in 1976, election to Oriental Guide in 1977, and culminating in election to Potentate in 1981. He was elected Imperial Representative and in 1979, 1980, and 1981 and served as Aide to Imperial Captain of the Guard in 1980-81.

It was also a very innovative year. Having learned that 1961 Potentate Ill. Sir Charlie Snapp held an Open Installation of the Divan, Ken scheduled a similar Open Installation which included the Pageant of Units which previously had been held during Bahia's Potentate's Balls. Ken thought it would bring the public and Bahia closer together, and he considers this one of his fondest memories and is pleased that it has become an annual event every year since 1981.

Ill. Sir Ken started the Bingo Program in 1978 for our Building Fund.

The first Children's Outreach Clinic was held in Orlando in May 1981. Members of the Greenville Hospital came to Orlando and with the help of Orlando Regional Medical Center and facilities of Holiday Hospital, accomplished an outstanding Clinic. It was Ken's pleasure to support a motion presented to establish a new Shriners Hospital for Children in Tampa which would open in 1984.

By Ken's quiet but firm leadership, Bahia enjoyed many successful activities in 1981. The Potentate's Banquet was held at the Marriott Inn and the Ball was held at Bahia on February 14th. The Annual Shrine Circus was held in Daytona Beach on March 21st and 22nd, and in Orlando at the Tangerine Bowl on March 28th and 29th and produced \$61,485.52 toward Bahia's 1981 budget of \$301,800.00.

Ceremonials were held in Orlando on May 29th and 30th in honor of 1960 Potentate Vernon M. Scott (71 candidates), September 18th (74 candidates), and November 20th and 21st honoring the Memory of 1975 Potentate Sam H. Walkup, Jr. (40 candidates). By the end of 1981, Bahia's membership stood at 5,520.

The Potentate's Cruise was taken to San Juan and St. Thomas on June 14-21; and on October 7-15, a trip was taken to Munich, St. Moritz, and Innsbruck. The Paper Crusade was held on October 2nd and 3rd with proceeds reaching \$182,790.66.

The popularity of Ill. Sir Ken and Lady Jennie made 1981 an extremely happy year at Bahia. He says that of all the accomplishments of 1981, the ones he considers his greatest were the friendship, brotherhood, and camaraderie of his fellow Nobles. "These I will cherish forever." In addition, Ill. Sir Ken said he will always be grateful to Past Potentate Jeff Jordan for starting him as Outer Guard in 1973 thus allowing him the great experience of working toward becoming Potentate of Bahia.

As outgoing First Lady, Lady Jennie hosted a First Lady's Tea honoring 1982 First Lady Roberta Ballinger which became an annual event each year.

Following his term as Potentate, Ill. Sir Ken continued outstanding service to Bahia and Shrinedom. He was Aide to Imperial Marshal in 1982-83 and served as Assistant Director and Parade Marshal for the 1982, 1992, and 1998 Imperial Sessions held in Orlando and hosted by Bahia. He has served many years as Committee Chairman for Bahia's Annual Elections, Chairman of the Caravan Committee from 200-2005, and Secretary-Treasurer of Bahia's Sunshine Fund until 2014. In addition, he served on the Board of Governors of the Tampa Shrine Hospital for nine years and having served the maximum permitted three three-year terms and having attended at least seven Board meetings each year, he was elected an Emeritus Member of that Board of Governors in 2006.

BURN CARE

Shriners Children's makes significant contributions to pediatric burn care

In the mid-1960s, the Shriners fraternity and the physicians at Shriners Children's hospitals observed a dire need. There were adult burn centers in the United States, and military burn centers, but no centers that specialized in children. So, the decision was made to open the very first pediatric burn center in the United States, on the campus of the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, Texas.

According to recent figures, one quarter of all burn injuries occur in children.

Shriners Children's has been at the forefront of burn care, and advancing it, ever since.

For instance:

- A critical staple of burn care is the pressure garment. These elastic sleeves, gloves and masks are worn during healing to prevent some of the heavy scarring that occurs after a severe burn. Customized, pressure garment therapy was pioneered at Shriners Children's Galveston location shortly after it opened.
- Research at Galveston also established the benefits of exercise after a burn injury.
- Large burns cause the body to go into a hypermetabolic state. This state will cause the body to consume its own muscle if the patient does not get proper nutrition and exercise. The loss can be debilitating, as the hypermetabolic state can last a year or more. Shriners Children's researchers in Galveston showed that deliberate exercise helps preserve muscle in burn patients.

- In 1988, Ronald Tompkins, M.D., of the Shriners Children's Boston hospital, showed definitively that surgically removing burnt tissue in large burns improved survival in children. That is now established practice worldwide.
- In 1981, John Burke, M.D., of Shriners Children's Boston, announced that his team had developed the first practical synthetic skin. It was a tremendous advance, because it holds in fluids and keeps out infections where previous wound grafts did not.

When Shriners Children's came to burns, only half of children admitted to a hospital with burns covering 64% of their body survived. These days, due to the advances made, Shriners Children's burn surgeons routinely save children burned over 90% of their bodies.
